

WHY IPHONE FILMMAKING?



A long time ago, you needed giant cameras and expensive studios to make movies. Now? All you need is an idea, your iPhone, and some creativity.

iPhone filmmaking is:

- Affordable You already have the camera!
- Portable Take it anywhere, anytime.
- Powerful iPhones now shoot in high-quality formats used by real filmmakers.
- Movies are about stories, not just cameras. You can create your own movies starting today.

THE CAMERA IN YOUR POCKET



Your iPhone camera has different modes for different styles of storytelling:

- **E** Video Mode Perfect for everyday filming.
- III Cinematic Mode Blurs the background for that Hollywood look.
- 🐆 Slow Motion (Slo-Mo) Capture dramatic detail.
- I Time-Lapse Make hours pass in seconds.

APPS THAT MAKE YOU A PRO



Your iPhone camera is powerful, but apps give you more control:

- Blackmagic Camera App $\clubsuit \rightarrow$ Full manual settings like a pro camera.
- Open Gate → Use the full sensor for wide cinematic shots.
- Editing Apps:
- iMovie Simple beginner editing.
- CapCut Fun edits with effects.
- DaVinci Resolve (iPad) Professional-level editing & color.

SHOOTING IN APPLE PRORES



Apple ProRes is a video format that keeps all the details.

Benefits:


- Smoother editing.
- Rich, natural colors.
- Professional quality.
- 1 ProRes uses a lot of storage save it for your best projects.

4K, RESOLUTION, AND SETTINGS



- $720p \rightarrow Low quality$.
- 1080p (HD) → Good for YouTube.
- 4K → Super clear, best for big screens.
- — Shoot in 4K if you can it makes your videos pop!

FRAME RATES: 24FPS, 30FPS, 60FPS



- 24fps → Classic movie look.
- $30 \text{fps} \rightarrow \text{Online standard}$.
- 60fps → Smooth, great for action or slow-mo.
- F Start with 24fps in 4K for your short films.

SLO-MO & TIME-LAPSE



- Slo-Mo: 120fps or 240fps → capture tricks, dances, water splashes.
- Time-Lapse: Turn hours into seconds → sunsets, traffic, cleaning your room.

ESSENTIAL GEAR



Helpful tools to upgrade your films:


- Tripod → steady shots.
- Clip-on mic \rightarrow clear sound.
- Ring light → bright lighting.
- Or... just use natural window light!

SHOOTING TIPS FOR BEGINNERS



- Clean your lens *.
- Hold sideways (landscape).
- Lock focus/exposure in apps.
- Use wide shots + close-ups.
- Move slowly to avoid shaky footage.

FRAMING THE SHOT



- Hold your phone sideways (landscape).
- Keep the camera steady.
- Use both hands or a tripod.
- Rule of Thirds: Imagine your screen has a grid place faces at the cross points!

LIGHTING BASICS



- Natural light = your best friend 🌼
- Face the light, don't hide from it.
- Lamps & flashlights can help indoors.

SOUND MATTERS!



- Quiet location = clear sound 🕡
- Stay close to your subject.
- Use earbuds or small mics if you have them.

PLANNING YOUR SCENE



- Every movie starts with a plan:
- Who's in it?
- Where is it?
- What happens?
- Draw storyboards or write a quick script!

DIRECTING LIKE A PRO



- As a director, you're the leader!
- Tell your actors what to do.
- Make sure the camera is rolling.
- Keep the energy fun.

SHOOTING TRICKS



- Wide shot: shows the whole scene.
- Medium shot: shows waist up.
- Close-up: shows emotion on the face.
- Mix shots to make it exciting!

EDITING MAGIC



- On your iPhone, use iMovie, CapCut, or VN Editor.
- Cut out mistakes.
- Add music 🎜
- · Add titles or credits.

ADD MUSIC & SOUND EFFECTS



- Music sets the mood
- Funny sounds make scenes pop! 😂
- Use royalty-free music or make your own beats.

FUN CHALLENGES



- Make a 1-minute movie.
- Slo-mo action trick.
- Cinematic dramatic scene.
- Time-lapse cleaning or sunset.

STORYTELLING IS KEY



Great stories matter more than fancy cameras. Ask:

- Who's my main character?
- What do they want?
- What's stopping them?
- How does it end?

YOUR FIRST SHORT FILM



Steps to make your first film:

- 1. Write a short story.
- 2. Plan your shots.
- 3. Film in 4K, 24fps.
- 4. Edit in iMovie or CapCut.
- 5. Add music + share it!

SHARE YOUR FILM



- Show your family & friends.
- Upload to YouTube, TikTok, or Instagram.
- Enter film festivals for kids! 🞬

INSPIRATION



Directors like Steven Soderbergh have filmed entire movies on iPhones! If they can, so can you.

• Your phone is more than a selfie machine, it's your gateway to Hollywood storytelling.

GOAL: MAKE YOUR VIDEOS LOOK LIKE REAL MOVIES BY USING 4K, 24 FPS, CINEMATIC MODE, AND (IF YOUR PHONE SUPPORTS IT) APPLE PRORES.

Set your main video to 4K at 24 fps

- Open Settings
- Scroll down → tap Camera
- Tap Record Video
- Choose 4K at 24 fps
- (Tip: On newer iPhones you can also change this right in the Camera app using the little HD/4K and 24/30/60 buttons at the top.)

Turn on Apple ProRes (advanced, if your iPhone supports it)

- In Settings > Camera, tap Formats
- Turn on Apple ProRes
- (Pro models only) Tap ProRes Encoding → pick HDR, SDR, or Log
 - Bigger files, better quality. You'll see a ProRes button in the Camera app's
 Video mode to toggle it on/off when filming.

Make Cinematic mode look "movie-ish"

Open Settings > Camera

Tap Record Cinematic

Pick 4K at 24 fps (or 4K at 30 fps)

On iPhone 14/15/16 models you can also switch HD/4K and 24/25/30 right on the camera screen with quick toggles.

Bonus "pro" touches (optional but helpful)

- Turn on Grid & Level (helps framing with rule of thirds):
- Settings > Camera → switch on Grid and Level. <u>Apple Support</u>
- Lock White Balance / Lock Camera (steadier color & fewer lens switches):
- Settings > Camera > Record Video → turn on Lock White Balance and (if shown)
 Lock Camera.


